

Treasurer, Wendy Saniti, asked to remind everyone to watch for your maintenance bills in November for payment due on January 1, 2026. At this time [October 11] we don't know what the yearly increase will be but make sure you receive your mailing in November.

Again, there will be at least one opening on the Board in 2026 as Cindy Ahrens is retiring. It is essential that there needs to be a full Board of 5 members to handle the business of our community. Due to the calendar and the time for printing and mailing the material, the deadline for any applications for the Board MUST BE SUBMITTED TO DEDE LABELLE OR CINDY AHRENS BY DECEMBER 15, 2025. Please consider this opportunity, talk with any Board member if you have questions or interest in the Board.

Board member Bradford Colvin (ARC) wants to make sure our members understand some information he wants to share:

- 1) Any location flag is only good for 14 days, after that, relocation is required.
- 2) As far as contractors, all work on homes, roofing, plumbing, electrical, and structural work requires a licensed contractor with a permit. A handyman is good for "cosmetic" work, painting, etc.
- 3) Any work done without a license and permit be aware that your home insurance company may not pay for any repairs or damages.
- 4) Also, a written contract will save a lot of headaches and serves as your record of all work to be done.

Brad has offered that he is available for any concerns from residents in Pine Lakes – he may be able to help you with issues.



#### "SPOTLIGHT ON OUR VETERANS"

#### Don Hudson • US Air Force

Don was born in Nashville, TN, on November 4, 1928, to David Devotion Hudson, Jr, and his mom, Francis. He had one brother who died of a heart condition at the age of 48, a smoker. His first wife, Wanda, and he had two sons and two daughters. The youngest son, now 72, jokes with him, "Dad, you are not getting older, you are old."

I'll save you the arithmetic, he will be 97 this November.

Don graduated from high school in 1946. A Marine Reserve unit was formed in his community during his senior year. The Marines recruited heavily at the high school. Don's two best friends joined and tried to convince him to join. Having dreamed of becoming a pilot, he decided not to join them. If he was going into the service, he was going to join the Air Force.

A lot happened in 1950. He joined the Air National Guard in TN; his two best friends died, one on his first day in Korea; he married Wanda, whom he had met in college; his unit was activated. The unit performed tactical reconnaissance with B-25s and P-51s. He was stationed at Shaw AFB in North Carolina where he served in personnel as Senior Career Guidance Counselor and essentially ran the administration for the wing. He was promoted to staff sergeant before being honorably discharged in 1953. He recalled having an infantry unit on base doing maneuvers. One year there was a storm with torrential rainfall for four days. He said it was comical seeing all the pup tents set up on the airfield.



Don attempted to return to college under the GI Bill but was unable to support his family which now had not only a wife, but the first son. So, he went to work for Western Auto for ten years.

He was finally able to return to Vanderbilt, where he earned his undergraduate degree, Masters of Education and started his PhD program. Some unforeseen issue arose during his thesis preparation, and he was unable to

attain the full doctorate. He went to Fisk and earned his second Masters. Being unaware of this school's pedigree, I inquired. It and Marshall are considered two of the best Historically Black Colleges/Universities in the country. Interesting fact, Don is white. Think about that – a white man in a black school in the 60s.

After graduating, he and his wife became immersed in educating young students. He served as principal in various K – 12 school districts and was tasked routinely with desegregating them. In 1988 he was named Tennessee National Distinguished Principal. He is quite proud of the many programs he was able to initiate that live on in today's public schools. He started the foster grandparents' program in Tennessee and today it is common all over the US. He also started the school breakfast program. "Kids were hungry," he said. It started small and quickly caught on around the country.

Don and Wanda retired and moved into Pine Lakes in 1988. They adapted to retirement quickly and enjoyed the Florida lifestyle until 2019 when Wanda passed.

Seventy years together. He met Mary Ann in church, and they were married in 2022. He is very proud of Mary Ann's musical career. He told me she had performed in New York City at the age of 16. He shared some of her remarkable experiences including teaching Hebrew to some children. He told me several times how lucky he has been in matters of love.

Don is like a lot of veterans, not really expecting accolades for doing his duty. I thanked him for sharing his story.
