ood day fellow residents. As you know this winter season has been unusually cool and rainy but hopefully the weather will turn around for the better by the time this issue comes out. Since our last HOA meeting, Ray Walton has resigned his position on our Board so he can devote his time to being VP of the PLGA. Thank you, Ray, for your work and dedication to our HOA.

I can't emphasize enough how your HOA needs your \$25 membership each year. I get asked "what does the HOA do for us". Let's begin by saying that the largest cost for the HOA is the yearly Insurance bill. We pay 2/3 and the Estate HOA pays 1/3. Our insurance covers liability for the HOA sponsored events in our clubhouse. Without this Insurance, each group would need to buy their own insurance for EACH event they have and make ticket prices higher to cover that cost. Your HOA also donates money to groups in your community to promote goodwill.

Did you know that \$5 of the \$25 membership goes to our Legal Fund. Knowing the issues we have had with ELS, the HOA needs to build up our legal funds in case we need to litigate in court. We are the liaison between us residents and the Management of our community. Sometimes items take longer than anticipated, which is discouraging to all of us, but I can promise you that we fight to get things done. I see a few "Facebook warriors" out there that are quick to criticize but never in line to help or even come to any meetings.

With all being said, I'm asking you to join your HOA. In the next month you will see your Board members coming around to get residents to join. Your HOA Board is here to help so please help us.



"SPOTLIGHT ON OUR VETERANS"

Shelby Greene – Aviation Boatswain Mate 3rd Class Born June 13, 1937, in Oceola, Arkansas. Had one brother and one sister, both deceased. His dad was a sharecropper and unhappy with his pay. The family moved to Michigan when Shelby was 6 so his dad could work in a factory. He and Judie, his wife, were neighbors growing up. Shelby chuckled and said, "I knew her when she was in diapers." They got married in May 1960 and had one son, Mitchell, who is a four-year Marine vet and lives in Ecuador.

Joined the Navy in March 1956, in Lansing, Michigan. Flew to San Diego for "boot camp" on a Pan Am Constellation. He was impressed with the power and luxuriousness of the plane. After eleven weeks of boot camp, he was assigned to Ream Field, San Ysidro, California, where he worked in communications – radio repair, switchboard operation, repair, and maintenance. Interestingly, this base was considered the helicopter capital of the world at the time.

He liked the duty there because his commander told him and his three comrades that their mission was to keep the switchboard operating 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and left it to them as to how they wanted to do that. They worked out a schedule where one of them had three days off periodically. Shelby, being industrious, worked part time at a gas station for extra money on his days off. After only one year he was reassigned to the USS Bennington CVA20. CVA stands for Carrier Vessel Attack.

Shelby was one of those guys who hooked the planes to the catapult for launching. If you saw the movie Top Gun, you saw this work performed. It looks sexy, but it is extremely dangerous. The aircraft on this ship were mostly jets with some prop driven. His job was to attach the catapult hook to the plane and then to roll out under the wing and remain clear of the aircraft as it revved the engines and was jettisoned off the ship. All the while being careful not to get in the path of the next aircraft in line.

During training one night, a pilot of one of the prop planes got excited and started revving the engines before the hook was attached. Shelby got the hook attached but had to hold onto it to prevent being blown out under the plane into the next prop plane in line.




