
At the March HOAII meeting, there was a lively discussion about the best ways to encourage our neighbors to join the HOAII. The conversation revealed that many residents mistakenly believe that HOAII membership is included in their monthly lot fees. Additionally, there was some confusion regarding the responsibilities of the HOAII board versus those of ELS management. We aim to clarify these roles here.

What Does Your HOAII Do for You?

The HOAII provides and pays for insurance for all clubs and events you attend. It serves as a liaison between homeowners and ELS management to address issues within the community. The HOAII also keeps up to date on new policies and regulations impacting the community, provides a forum for homeowners to express concerns and suggestions, ensures venue availability and clean-up after events, coordinates with various clubs for equipment and safety, and stays in contact with ELS management to ensure deficiencies in the community are addressed, such as issues with the pool, clubhouse, tennis/bocce/pickleball courts, and horseshoe pit. We also contribute to various Clubs in our Community. HOAII also supports the Monday night food trucks and the Pine Lakes CERT (Community Emergency Response Team).

ELS is responsible for grounds maintenance, including tree trimming, road maintenance, and amenity maintenance. They also handle storm clean-up, garbage/ recycle services, community rules and prospectus, and the management of The Pub and The Sand Trap.

By understanding the distinct roles of HOAII and ELS, residents can better appreciate the efforts made to maintain and improve our community. We encourage everyone to get involved and support the HOAII in its mission to enhance our living environment. Membership is only \$25 per year. VETERAN'S ASSOCIATION

National Military Appreciation Month (NMAM) is celebrated every May and is a declaration that encourages U.S. citizens to observe the month as a symbol of unity. NMAM honors current and former members of the U.S. Armed Forces, including those who have died in the pursuit of freedom. May is characterized by six national observances highlighting the contributions of those who have served.

MEMORIAL DAY (originally known as Decoration Day) began after the Civil War with both formal and informal ceremonies at graves and ceremonies for the

soldiers who had fallen in battle. Many places claim to be the birthplace of Memorial Day in 1866, including Waterloo, New York, and Macon and Columbus, Georgia. On May 5, 1868, the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR), a Union veterans' organization, established Decoration Day, May 30, as a time for the nation to decorate the dead with flowers. Arlington National Cemetery held the first large observance later that year.

By the end of the 19th century, Memorial Day ceremonies were held throughout the country on May 30. The Army and Navy adopted policies for proper observances, and state legislatures passed proclamations designating the day. After World War I, the day was expanded to honor those who died in all American wars, and in 1971, Memorial Day was declared a national holiday to be celebrated on the last Monday in May.

Jerry Beamer U.S. Army Data Processing Operator

Jerry was born at home in New Chester, PA (population 20), in 1941. Really! In his parents' house! The doctor delivered a neighbor's baby girl and then came to their house to deliver him half an hour later. He has two brothers and one sister, 65 first cousins!

Grade school was in a small country schoolhouse. During high school in New Oxford, PA, he played baseball, basketball and golf. He worked four hours daily on weekdays at a brick factory loading trucks manually with a 10-brick tong, one tong at a time, then full time following high school graduation in 1959. He noticed all the old-time employees had a hunched over posture and thought, "not for me."


A US Army recruiter offered him a school of choice and introduced the term data processing to him. Sounded good. He signed up. Went to Fort Jackson, SC for basic. Eight weeks later, shipped to Indianapolis, Fort Benjamin Harrison, to learn machine operations. He was assigned to the 7th Army Stock Control Center in Zweibruken, Germany where he worked with a group of German national and military personnel using "state of the art" IBM computers. He liked the work and travelled throughout Europe during his time off. Oktoberfest in Munich was fun!



The Berlin Wall and the Cuban crisis extended his honorable discharge date to February 23, 1963. In May, '63 he found programming work in Minneapolis for an automotive parts manufacturing company. Two and a half years later Honeywell hired him to work in Sales support and Sales, where he stayed for 34 years.

Married in '64, two daughters, both very successful. Sadly, lost his first wife to cancer in '98. Married his lovely wife, Shar, in '02. This is their 19th season in Florida as snowbirds. They call Turtle Lake, Wisconsin their home.


