TEXAS HOLDEM

We at Pine Lakes play Texas Holdem every Monday evening all YEAR ROUND. We never take a break unless management closes the Clubhouse. Our game is open to men and women and their guests over the age of 18 who live in Pine Lakes or Lake Fairways.

Our game starts at 7:00PM sharp, however we begin taking names, money and placing players at a table at 6:30. So get there a little early. It only costs \$12.00 for an evening of card playing entertainment. Your \$12.00 buys You \$10,000 worth of playing chips. You select your seat by drawing a chip from a pouch which will have the table and seat number where you will sit.

When the game begins our blinds start at \$100 and \$200 and go up every 15 minutes. (Blinds are like an anti.) At about 8:30 we have a short break and around 9:00 the game is over. We then payout money to the top players and first place always pays \$100.00 or more based on how many players we had on any given night. Additionally, if you run out of chips before 8:30 we let you rebuy another \$10,000 worth of chips for \$10.00. This is strictly your choice. Rebuys allow us to enhance the prize money.

Your \$12.00 admission fee also gives you entry into our ROYAL FLUSH JACK POT which pays the winner a minimum of \$50.00 to a maximum of \$350.00. Anyone getting a hand of 4 ACES wins at least \$50.00 to as much as \$150. \$2.00 of your entry fee goes as prize money to the person with the highest hand of the night so if we have 25 people playing the person with the high hand for night wins \$50.00.

VETERAN'S ASSOCIATION

We continued discussion and planning of the upcoming Veteran's Day weekend activities.

Veterans Day -- Saturday November 11, 2023 at 11:00am - Ceremony with Lunch provided afterwards. We invite the entire community to come help us honor all Veterans. The ceremony will be in front of the Pine Lakes Clubhouse, seating is provided. Please come early, as the ceremony starts promptly at 11:00am.

Veteran's Dance – Sunday November 12, 2023 6:00pm – 8:00pm – The Suncoast Swing Band will provide the music and a special salute to our Veterans. Contact Tim Mercurio for tickets (just \$10) - 513-300-7877

Important Dates in Military History – November:

National Veteran and Military Family Month - was established in 1996 by the Armed Services YMCA, with the U.S. Government recognizing the occasion every year since. Each November, the President signs a proclamation declaring November National Veterans & Military Families Month, and with hundreds of thousands of service members deployed overseas, recognizing the daily sacrifices made by active duty, Guard, and Reserve military families has never been more important.

Warrior Care Month - In 2008, Secretary of Defense Robert F. Gates announced the creation of programs to address the needs of wounded warriors. Those efforts have resulted in each branch of service offering its own version of help for those sick or injured in the line of duty. The 2008 efforts also resulted in an entire month devoted to raising the awareness of these people, their sacrifices, and their families. Warrior Care Month is observed by the DoD each November with special programs, publications, events, and more.

10 November - Marine Corps Birthday - On Nov. 10th, 1775 the Continental Congress passed a resolution creating two battalions of Marines. According to the resolution, the Continental Marine Corps sought men who were "good seamen, or so acquainted with maritime affairs as to be able to serve to advantage by sea." Hundreds of men answered the call and mustered under the first Commandant, Samuel Nicholas. His first enlisted men found their way to Tun Tavern in Philadelphia, and the Marine Corps was born.

11 November - Veterans Day - Veterans Day is observed every year on Nov. 11. Veterans Day evolved from Armistice Day, which was proclaimed in 1919 by President Woodrow Wilson. Armistice Day recognizes the end of World War I, when fighting ceased at the 11th hour, on the 11th day, of the 11th month in 1918. (Nov. 11th at 11 A.M, 1918). On Nov. 11, 1947 Raymond Weeks, a World War II veteran, organized a "National Veterans Day" parade in Birmingham, Alabama, to recognize veterans of all wars, according to the Department of Veterans Affairs. According to the Emporia Convention and Visitors Bureau official site, "In 1953 Veterans Day was organized and celebrated in Emporia, Kansas; one year prior to the first nationwide observance on Nov. 11, 1954." These celebrations may have influenced Congress to change Armistice Day to Veterans Day in 1954 to recognize veterans of all U.S. wars. President Dwight D. Eisenhower made Nov. 11 the official national observance of Veterans Day after Kansas Congressman Ed Rees (who was from Emporia) proposed the bill in Congress to change Armistice Day to Veterans Day. According to History.com, Veterans Day wasn't always held on Nov. 11. In 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Holidays Bill, moving Veterans Day to the fourth Monday in October beginning in 1971. But, in 1975 President Gerald Ford returned the observance to Nov. 11. Remembrance Day, also known as Armistice Day or Poppy Day, is technically meant to honor the end of World War I, which occurred at 11 am on the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918. But Remembrance Day has long been a time to pay respect to the fallen from all wars. Traditions used to observe Remembrance Day include the wearing of poppies, and a two-minute silence at 11 AM on the eleventh day of the eleventh month. Although **Veterans Day** is observed in the U.S. on Nov. 11, Remembrance Day functions elsewhere in the world more closely related to **Memorial Day** in May.

TURKEY, MASHED POTATOES, GRAVY, CRANBERRIES, PUMPKIN PIE, AND STUFFING!

These traditional foods of Thanksgiving are a way to remind us of living off the land (farm life) and that we really are dependent on the land even today to survive whether we realize it or not in this modern millennium. People today eat these foods as a way of universally joining together to worship and give thanks (much alike the Last Supper in the bible). When an entire nations is presumably eating the very same thing on the same day, it is a way of symbolically becoming one. And it also helps renew our ties with working the soil.

Ironically, the first Thanksgiving probably didn't have any pumpkin pie as we know it today. Why? The pilgrims didn't really have many ingredients to make pastry back then. Stuffing wasn't probably eaten due to lack of flour and bread. They weren't going to waste their bread stuffing it inside a turkey. They'd simply eat it as a loaf.

Corn on the cob wasn't eaten back then because Indian corn is different (harder) and all they ate was probably just cornbread from cornmeal. Sweet potatoes were not even common to our area. No one had heard of them back in 1620. And potatoes were probably boiled, let alone mashed. Forget gravy also.

What might they have eaten? Fish like cod, bass and herring. Of course there were crabs, lobsters, oysters and mussells. For meats they had the turkey, but also partridge, moose, venison and ducks. They also had nuts available as well as some vegetables and edible roots.



Tomb of the Unknown Soldier

The US did not begin honoring it's war dead until 1921. It was at this time the remains of an unknown American soldier (who died fighting in France) were disinterred and transported back to the US. The remains were referred to as the "unknown soldier" were kept at the Capitol in Washington, D.C. lying in state for 3 days. Then they were moved to their final resting place at Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia. To honor these men, (who symbolize all Americans who gave their lives in all wars) an Army honor guard, the 3d U.S. Infantry (The Old Guard), keeps day and night vigil.

The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier had only the unidentified soldier from WWI in it for many years. Then in 1958, two more unidentified American soldiers who died in WWII, and one from the Korean War were buried next to the soldier from WWI. Now 3 unidentified soldiers were in the tomb.

Technically, the Viet Nam War wasn't a declared war. It was a conflict. But, in 1973, a law was passed giving internment of an unknown American soldier who died

in the Viet Nam War. But because our technology has advanced so much in identifying the deceased, it wasn't until 1984 that this unidentified soldier was buried in the tomb with the others.

However, due to the advancements in science with DNA testing, in 1998 the unknown soldier from the Viet Nam War was identified as Michael Blassie, 24 yrs., Air Force pilot shot down in May 1972 near the Cambodian border. His body was then disinterred and reburied by his family in St. Louis, Missouri.

He'd call plays before the ref. I don't know who had the dirtiest mouth, Joey or me. Joey loved roller coasters and would travel to Coney Island just to ride them.

Joey and Pam got married in our clubhouse. He and Pam helped his dad by making photo buttons 'for the Candlelighters. He rang bells with his sister and nephews for the Salvation Army which we did under the banner of Pine Lakes.

Joey loved Oreo cookies and Taco Bell. Joey was diabetic. That's how he lost his eyesight and became a pin cushion until he went on an insulin pump to keep him alive. His favorite holiday was Halloween and he would lay in his coffin and scare everyone who came by. So far over fifteen hundred dollars has been raised for his favorite charity - Dog and Cat Shelter. He loved his dogs and cat

I miss him every day. I'd like to thank everybody for their compassion, caring, and love. The tears I shed will not stop. He will be my Joey forever- loved, cherished, and never forgotten. God called Joey Home because something worse was going to affect him and for that I am grateful. Thank you all who cared enough to come to his funeral. A special thank you for keeping my family in your prayers. Hug and love your children everyday because you just never know.


