Community Government

November Liaison Meeting

This meeting was held on November 13, 2014

The pool gates are still on schedule to be installed by December 15, 2014. It is hoped that we can use the same keys for access that were previously distributed to the residents.

The pool speakers and radio are now working properly. New signs for the pool are being reviewed by the ELS legal department. Due to the various problems at the pool on weekends, starting Thanksgiving weekend, a roving guard will be patrolling the pool area. This will continue through the season. Small signs will be placed on the pool umbrellas asking residents to lower the umbrella when they leave the pool area.

A pergola has been purposed for the outdoor kitchen area at the pool. The purpose of this structure is to provide shade for volunteers cooking at the grilles during the pool parties. The pergola has received all approvals necessary and construction will begin as time permits.

The issue of visitors entering our community is always a concern. New visitor passes will be used as soon as they are received from the supplier. A hanging pass will be used for the restaurant. Dashboard passes will be used for medical, tennis, and golf that have emblems identifying them. Personal visitors will also have dashboard passes. Do we have a lot of visitors? About 500 visitor passes are issued each week.

The 2015 budget still has the recommended money for road repair. Although the budget has not received final approval, no one in our management chain of command expects any reductions. Julie is working to get recommendations and bids for road repair at the present time.

The size and number of dogs in the community is causing concern and confusion. ELS rules for the community override the estate owners covenants and the prospectus. On page 9 of "Rules and Regulations for Pine Lakes Manufactured Home Community" dated June 30, 1988 states 'Tenants are limited to one cat or dog per home. Dogs shall not be larger than 30 pounds in weight. Park owner reserves the right to refuse admittance to the park to any pet depending upon the circumstances surrounding that pet's compatibility to the park in general.' Discussion on this topic continued for some time. It was noted that if the pet owner has a letter from a doctor identifying the dog as a companion or service animal, the rule cannot be enforced.

Julie stated that rules concerning pets as well as horticulture and trash pick up rules will be published on the front of the December calendar.

The cost differential for golf membership between Pine Lakes and Lake Fairways was discussed. Julie felt there was nothing they could do for 2015 as many have already paid their fees. She said she would discuss the issue with her management and recommend that the fees be equal for 2016.

People continue to make right turns from the left lanes and left turns from the right lane when exiting the clubhouse driveway onto Pine Lakes Boulevard and when exiting the community onto Route 41. Julie agreed to have arrows painted in the respective lanes.

People who have not responded to letters requesting them to do maintenance work on their homes or vards will receive followup letters and action will be taken by ELS to do the maintenance. The home owner will be charged. See the manager's letter in this issue.

A trash can will be placed at the horticulture dump site so the bags used to carry the waste to the site can be placed in the trash.

The subject of easels in the lobby was raised. These have been previously banned due to safety concerns. The Day of Caring easel and ELS easel are the two there now. The ELS easel as well as the brochure holder will be moved to the sales office. The Day of Caring easel will come down as soon as the Christmas decorations are in place. We will try to find an alternative place for the day of caring poster next year,

Various areas that need more attention to cleaning were discussed.

The liaison meetings are held the second Thursday of each month. Residents are encouraged to give issues they would like to see addressed to their respective HOA board members.

Julie will be doing the 360 inspections in January or February 2015 for the estate section. 360 inspections are where management drives around and looks at the properties to be sure they are being maintained in accordance with the covenants and rules and regulations. Please refer to Article 5.11 of your covenants. Here are some specific tips:

- Check for weeds and make sure your bushes are trimmed
- See if your siding is in need of powerwashing
- Take a close look at the garage doors and shutters – is it time for a fresh coat of paint?
- Do your palm trees need a trim?
- Is your yard light in working order?

Let's see if we can pass inspection with no violations. In a recent newsletter from our manager, the policy for violations was published. See letter from manager on page 9.

PLEHOA Meeting November 12, 2014 Minutes

Prior to the start of the formal meeting, President Putnam introduced Leane Atchison who has been Pine Lakes' Welcome Wagon representative for the past 14 years. She is stepping down and asked for a few minutes in order to introduce her replacement Lucille Fuller. Leane remarked how much she has enjoyed her role and is confident that Lucille will carry out the duties just fine.

The regular monthly meeting of the Pine Lakes Homeowners' Association was held on this date. President Luanne Putnam called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. In attendance, in addition to President Putnam, were Vice President Charlie Matthews, ARC Chair Bo Kromas, Treasurer Pete Williams, and Secretary Peter Talty. There were also 35 guests present.

The Secretary's report was read and being no corrections, a Motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Pete Williams provided a treasurer's report covering the last two months up to November 14, 2014 which was accepted. The details can be found in the posted copies.

ARC Report: Bo Kromas reported that although he has received several phone calls of inquiry, there were just two formal requests processed and approved for color changes: 25K and 8J.

President stated that information from the Liaison meeting was covered in detail in the Whispering Pines so there was no need to repeat this. She will attend the next Liaison meeting tomorrow and will report on this at our next meeting. Updates on some of the items will be addressed under either Old and New Business.

OLD and NEW BUSINESS:

President Putnam updated the members on the following items:

1. Shuffleboard Courts:

The latest information from Julie Flake contradicts what was said by Steve Foligno when he said that the contractor reported that the courts were not repairable, and he would not undertake the job because the courts were in such poor shape that he could not guarantee his work. Julie now says that instead of the courts being removed and replaced at the cost to ELS of \$12,000 per court, they are now only going to be re-surfaced at the cost of only \$12,000 for all six courts. Julie also said if this work does not prove satisfactory, she will seek the additional money from ELS to replace all of the courts in a year. This is disappointing news because the shuffleboard courts are an amenity that we pay ELS to maintain.

2. Marketable Record Title Act (MRTA):

We have been informed by the attorney for the insurance company for our HOA Board that our covenants are not providing us the protection we once thought. This is one more indication that our HOA attorneys are not meeting our needs, and we are exploring the possibility of replacing them.

 Our covenants are adequate for now and do not need to be re-recorded until 2017. Therefore, President Putnam asked for a Motion to rescind the Motion approved at our last meeting to authorize Becker & Poliakoff to proceed with re-recording of our covenants. A Motion was made to this effect, seconded, and passed. 4. <u>Status of Delinquent Properties:</u>

It was with areat pleasure that President Putnam was able to report that at this time we have no delinquent properties. The saga of 170 was a convoluted nightmare resulting in the loss of some revenue to the HOA. However, the decision to sue resulted in the judge "extinguishing the lien" we had placed against the property. This is where our covenants were inadequate and place us in a vulnerable position. Our HOA Board insurance attorneys informed us that our case was not strong, and to settle would be best for the residents. We were not charged any additional legal fees and they paid the \$2,500 to settle the case. All this is further evidence that new attorneys seems to be appropriate.

- 5. The January bills have gone out and are due upon receipt.
- 6. Julie Flake will begin the 360 Inspections of homes in January or February. Residents are asked to be sure their homes are in good shape. President Putnam will attempt to do her own 360 and provide feedback in writing to those homeowners whose homes are well maintained.
- A computer system, software, and protection for use by the treasurer was purchased for \$762.47 to ensure effective record-keeping and the accurate transfer of functions to subsequent treasurers.
- 8. We donated \$100 to the Beautification Committee for the purchase of Christmas decorations for the community.
- President Putnam apologized for not asking new homeowners to introduce themselves at the start of the meeting, but welcomed them and asked them to introduce themselves at this time.

Vice President Charlie Matthews recognized the valiant and tireless efforts Luanne Putnam has made in the past year on behalf of the HOA and residents of Pine Lakes.

Residents' Comments and Concerns:

President Putnam made note of these items and will bring them up at the Liaison meeting tomorrow and report back at the next meeting.

1. There is a buildup of algae in the bottom of the pool.

- 2. The Pub floor is filthy as are the bathrooms next to the pool.
- 3. The Memorial Walk is dangerous and not readily safely accessible.
- 4. Speeding continues to be a problem.
- 5. Quality of grass cutting is lacking and the grass cutters leave garbage from their lunches scattered about.
- 6. President Putnam has learned that the removal of trees no longer requires approval from Lee County. The HOA covenants also do not give the Board authority over tree removal. Therefore, it is asked that the homeowners respect the beauty that the trees bring to our community, and act responsibly when removing trees.

Meeting adjourned at 8:15 PM

Florida' State Legislature and Governor Could Impose a 7% Sales Tax on Top of Current Manufactured Rental Fees

A statewide FMO meeting on November 14 was hosted by Harbor View Park in Port Charlotte. In attendance from Pine Lakes were myself, my husband, Roy, Maura Alexander, Pine Lakes Leased Land Representative, as well as residents Ginny Dykes and Clair Webb. Guest speaker was Charlotte County's State Representative Ken Roberson. He has been in the legislature for over ten years and during that time has been a long-time and strong supporter of FMO and its mission and goals. Rep. Roberson stressed the critical need for increased membership in FMO because, to the state's governing bodies, membership is votes. A Membership Form is available on page 38.

"Getting increased membership in FMO is vital," he said.

In last year's session, a bill that would have added a 7% sales tax to all leased land fees in the state was defeated. Today we have a new legislature with new members and Rep. Roberson is sure the bill will surface again as it is already in effect in other states. This would mean that someone in Pine Lakes whose monthly lease is \$600, would increase to \$642 per month, with an annual fee of \$7704 instead of \$7200.

Our owner, ELS, is one of the country's largest owners of manufactured home communities in the country, owning over 250 communities in Florida alone. They retain half a dozen lobbyists in Tallahassee. FMO, because of poor membership and few dollars, has just one.

Petitioning our legislators by phone, letters and email is influential. In the past, legislators wooed FMO voters. That was 20 years ago. Times have changed and the numbers are down.

FMO membership is the key.
