C.E.R.T.

Lee County E.O.C. (Emergency Operations Center) and North Fort Myers Fire Department has asked the Pine Lakes C.E.R.T. team to help them identify residents that choose to stay in place when a Mandatory Evacuation Order has been issued by Florida State officials for manufactured homes (Pine Lakes). The Mandatory Evacuation Order is usually ordered when high winds are expected as with a hurricane, tornado, or a storm surge.

Our solution is to have **residents who choose to stay in place** complete a short form that can be obtained at the Gate House or concierge desk and deposit it in the Emergency Evacuation Box located on the exit side of the Gate House wall. This information may be used by First Responders to expedite rescue response time after a disaster.

ear Pine Lakes Leased Land Residents,

I want to congratulate all of the HOAII members who have paid their annual 2022 membership dues. Our HOAII membership is now at 375, which represents 64% of total leased land homes. This is the highest level of membership since I have been associated with the HOAII Board dating back to 2013! If any resident is not certain whether they have paid their 2022 membership dues, please contact Beverly Bynum, HOAII Treasurer, or myself.

I want to thank Mike Gloss for coordinating the Food Trucks which have served Pine Lakes residents for the last two months. They have been well patronized and equally appreciated.

As you are aware, the re-zoning request for the French farm was approved contingent upon an acceptable FDOT approved ingress/egress access to Rte. 41. In order to ensure that there is strict adherence to all aspects of the FDOT results, our two Pine Lakes HOA Board of Directors (PLEHOA and HOAII) have recently approved the hiring of an independent DOT Transportation Engineer/Planner who will audit the final results of the FDOT, to insure they have followed all the guidelines necessary for final approval...and to challenge them if they do not.

The monthly Liaison meetings with Jason Meyers will continue during the summer months. Jason has been very proactive on many of our requests for repairs / updates. Some of the projects he is working on are:

- Installing a wall and door in the men's bathroom at the pool
- Purchasing additional chairs for the clubhouse
- Fixing/replacing the dishwasher and sink faucet in the clubhouse kitchen
- Repairing the canopy at the pool
- Paving 6 cul de sacs (41-46), and the road to the driving range during the months of June-September
- Installing WiFi in the clubhouse
- Purchasing new name cul de sac number signs
- Repairing the hot tub
- Replacing tiles and wallboard in the kitchen storage area and records room in clubhouse
- Investigating approval for metal roofs on houses in Pine Lakes

Jason also inquired about starting a Neighbor helping Neighbor group of volunteer residents helping in yardwork, housework-type jobs for those residents who are not physically or financially able to complete these tasks themselves. The group would work in a similar fashion as FISH, where a coordinator would call a volunteer to perform the task. If you are interested in being a part of this proposed group, please call Jason or myself.

WEB PAGE UPDATES

Thy do I refresh my browser?

If you know a change has been made (such as when we update the address on your website), you will need to refresh the web page **in order to see the updated information** - refreshing the page tells the browser to go back to the server and see if there is anything new.

What does refreshing the webpage do?

In general, refresh is a way of describing reloading or updating what is being displayed or stored. For example, if you are on a web page, refreshing the page displays the most recent content published on that page. Essentially, you're asking the site to send your computer the newest version of the page you're viewing. If a Web page is updated on the server after it has been sent to the browser, the browser will continue to show the old page. Clicking "Refresh" is a new request to view the page, and the latest version of the page is then sent to the browser.

Why do you need to clear the cache?

Force-refreshing a page will **clear that page's cache**, **allowing you to see the most recent version of the page as opposed to any information your browser saved in the past:** Windows - Press Ctrl + F5. If that doesn't work, hold down Ctrl and click the "Refresh" icon.




