SEPTEMBER LIAISON MEETING

The September liaison meeting was held September 8 in the Living Room. The first item on the agenda was the gift of a shuffleboard table game for the clubhouse. Robert J. [Bob] Williams passed away in a hospice facility in Haverhill, Massachusetts, on Wednesday, September 7, 2016, after a lengthy illness and surgery at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, followed by stays in various rehabilitation facilities in that area.. Bob, and his loving companion of twenty-five years, Jean Rourke, were Pine Lakes residents going back to 2000.

Bob was born on June 23, 1933. His service in the U.S. Army is commemorated by a brick at the Pine Lakes veterans memorial. He was employed by Western Electric and Bell Core as a quality control inspector in Massachusetts. An avid photographer, Bob devoted much time and effort to photography for Whispering Pines and the Pine Lakes Men's and Women's Clubs. He especially enjoyed doing the photography for Candlelighters, the party for children with cancer that was held at Pine Lakes for many years.

Bob loved walking in the pool, reading, and playing bocce. If there was a show or a dinner dance in the Pine Lakes club house, it was a virtual guarantee that Bob and Jean would be there.....unless they were off on one of their many trips; they both loved to travel.

Bob and Jean were also almost always game for a trip to virtually any one of this area's assortment of restaurants. Dining out with their many friends was a major part of their social life. It was not necessary to do any arm twisting to get them to agree to going out for dinner.

Bob will be interred in Massachusetts. A celebration of his life will be held here at Pine Lakes at a later date. He will be missed by his many, many friends here at Pine Lakes.

For those of you who were here in 2012 and 2013, you may remember that we worked with the Lee County Homeless Coalition to coordinate blanket drives. The second year also brought many items of warm clothing and socks. Over 400 blankets alone were collected. Several new throws were also received.

Even in Pine Lakes, we have found that a little blanket and sometimes heat are needed to keep us comfortable. Our neighbors living in the outdoors, wherever it may be, should be able to keep warm too.

This includes men, women, and children. Currently, our area veterans are being assisted with housing through the Federal HUD Program. More homeless, including veterans, will migrate here for the winter.

The Coalition has indicated that they would appreciate our help again. So, we have agreed to do it again. To have a successful collection, we need your help. We do not ask for any money or your time--just any blankets, throws or quilts that you no longer need. We often bring more with us from the north that we will never use. This is an easy and very worthwhile way to pass them on

The general meeting of the Pine Lakes Homeowner's Association was held on September 14, 2016 in the Living Room of the Clubhouse. In addition to President Pete Williams, treasurer Dick Loubier, ARC chair Bob Wurst, and vice president Terry Brush (Peter Talty filled in for secretary Carl Schlachter) there were 26 homeowners present. Pete explained that Bob Wurst has agreed to finish Bo Kromas' term as ARC chair.

President Williams opened the meeting at 7:00 pm. After the Pledge of Allegiance new members introduced themselves, and Pete read the minutes from the meeting of May 11, 2016. Being no corrections or additions a motion was made and carried to accept the report as read.

Dick Loubier read the treasurer's report that was seconded and accepted with no corrections. The full report will be posted on the bulletin board across from the Exercise Room.

President Williams gave a report from the summer's Liaison Committee meetings, but focused on the main issues of concern and accomplishments:

1. The By-laws have been revised as part of the regulatory process for our HOA to remain in effect. The October meeting is reserved just for discussion of issues related to proposed changes as authored by our attorney. Tonight's meeting will not address Bylaws.
2. The shuffleboard table proposed for the billiard room is a dead issue.
3. The intended road re-surfacing was not done over the summer because of an equipment issue of the contractor's. This has been resolved, and the designated roads should be done by the end of September.
4. Lawn cutting issues continue to be numerous and unresolved. A new committee has been formed with all the key players in an effort to get better lawn cutting services. Pete specified that all problems need to be documented at the Receptionist's desk using the forms designated (forms are not presently available), and including photographs if possible. Many residents brought forth other problems and Pete reiterated the need for documentation including lot numbers.
5. Bridges are done and they did a great job. There are a few lighting and post issues, but the contractor is going to resolve these.

6. The lakes are being sprayed every two weeks with good results. Carp have been added to the lakes to consume the algae and these fish do not reproduce.
7. The 360 inspections continue, but letters are not sent to deficient homeowners until who verifies that the problem is as reported.
8. Clubhouse carpets have all been cleaned and the ballroom floor washed and waxed. All look beautiful.
9. The pool remains closed due to major work, but should be completed (weather permitting) in about three weeks.
10. Significant work was done on the golf course over the summer and it looks very good.

Resident concerns:

1. Provide more signs alerting people to the dangers that the alligators present. Also signs not to feed them or any other wild animals.
2. Trash pickup begins at 6:00 am and garbage can be put out the night before if it is in a covered receptacle.
3. People parking on the grass for extended periods of time make the community look bad.
4. Many issues about the by-laws changes were brought up, but referred to the October meeting.

New Business:

Whispering Pines is going to be printed by a local printer to reduce costs. The transition should be complete and coincide with the next scheduled publication due in October.

With no further business to conduct President Williams adjourned the meeting at 8:04 pm.


