PINE LAKES HOA II

Hello to all leased land residents. I would first like to begin by apologizing to Gary Nicolini for omitting his name last month when I thanked all the previous HOAII board members for their service to the Community. Gary previously served as Vice President and we are grateful to him.

I am re-printing a portion of an article Judy Hale wrote back in 2017 concerning the Pine Lakes Leased Land Homeowners Association, HOAII. Judy wrote it because at the time, there were some people who questioned what the HOAII Board did for them. They were very hesitant in spending \$20.00, at that time, for the annual membership. Judy stated that the HOAII has on a number of occasions taken legal action against ELS. One of these situations occurred in 2013 when ELS wanted to charge us for trash pick-up, which our Prospectus states is included in our lot rent. ELS charged us an additional \$117 that year for Waste Pro to pick up our trash. In addition, ELS overcharged us for using an incorrect CPI totaling another \$117 which we also fought and won. Long story short, after 6 hours of negotiation, ELS agreed to credit the residents for \$234. Over the course of 9 years since then, by correcting the unfair waste disposal fee, this action has saved Pine Lakes leased land residents \$117 per year, a total of \$613,899 or \$1,053 per home for a 9-year period. This action cost \$11,000 in attorney fees. Legal fees in 2021 also exceeded \$10,000. Also, just last month, we were able to obtain a credit of \$97 per household for an incorrect property tax charge due to the HOAII auditing the annual pass-thru expenses.

Unlike Estate homeowners, Chapter 723 does not allow HOAII to require members to pay dues. I am asking that each resident who has not yet joined our HOAII to please join. Reminder notices have recently been placed in your tubes.

With the exception of Fed-Ex, Amazon, UPS, and USPS, residents must call the gate to inform them of all visitors, and contractors coming to their home.

The dues money is spent to protect you, the leased land residents. The funds are used to pay for the insurance which covers all of our official club activities, such as dinners, dances, shows, home show, etc. We also pay for our tax preparation, holiday decorations, Secretary, Treasurer and President supplies and travel expenses, as well as the annual retainer fee for our attorney. We also support C.E.R.T., ARC (which helps maintain property values by insuring consistency and continuity of community standards), and Networking for Progress. The remainder from dues collected is transferred to our legal fund.

In summary, please consider utilizing the reminder notice and write a check for \$25.00. We need to increase our legal reserve with all that is happening with the ongoing ELS expansion, and its negative impact to Pine Lakes residents. Thank you.

Summarizing major items from the most recent Liaison meeting:

- Natalie is interviewing candidates for the Park Manager position.
- Natalie said that the major work in the pool is completed and may reopen prior to the March 1st date. The spa is not yet completed and may take longer to open. Pool furniture has been ordered and should be delivered soon.
- Natalie is working on hiring new waitresses in an attempt to keep the Pub open 7 days a week. If the Pub is to be closed on a particular day, Natalie will contract a food truck, as is done in other communities.
- Natalie stated that ELS personnel will follow up with all current Resident Concern forms. After two weeks, if you have not received a response from ELS, please let me know.
- ELS maintenance will look into the leaking roof in the kitchen storage area. Maintenance will also repair the oven fan and dishwasher in the kitchen.
- 2022 Capital projects were discussed. Major items include golf course irrigation system, and re-paving of cul-de-sacs. Will press for more specifics at next meeting.
- ELS has hired Diamond Security Co. to man the gates from 10:30pm to 5:30am.

BEAUTIFICATION NEWS

As a committee, we are wondering about the future of Beautification. How can we get more people to volunteer? Should we change our name? Do men think Beautification is too feminine? Should we change the committee to a club or has the time for the things Beautification does run its course?

You may not know all our work is for the betterment and enjoyment of the community. We hold 3 fundraisers a year, “The Welcome Back Pie and Ice Cream Social”, “The Christmas Sale” and the “Tour of Homes”. In our planning session last month, we talked about adding a fourth function in July.

The money we raise goes back into Pine Lakes. In the past we have added chairs and tables to the pool area, updated the lobby of the Clubhouse, and the decor by the pool. We will be repainting the candy canes this February. In the future we would like to enhance the appearance of the front of the clubhouse with four to six large decorative pots. While continuing to coordinate decorating for Christmas, sponsoring the Christmas Golf Cart parade, The Tour of Homes, and co-sponsor of the New Year’s Eve Bash. But we cannot do it by ourselves. **WE NEED YOUR HELP.**
