#### **NOVEMBER LIAISON MEETING**

The November Liaison meeting was held November 10th in the Living Room. As usual the meeting started with a discussion of homes which do not meet community standards in the maintenance of the outside of the house and the yard.

Then we moved on to the parking lot between the clubhouse and the Pub. The end of the parking lot nearest the lake needs repair where the tree roots are coming up through the black top. This is a hazard at night with the possibility of people tripping when getting in or out of their cars.

The drainage problems around cul-de-sac nine is being investigated by maintenance.

We are still working on a replacement for Ameripride with ELS accepting bids from other companies.

The repair of the bridge posts and the repair of the bulkheads on the lake buy the tenth tee and across from the fourth fairway may be pushed into 2017. Contract approval is in the final stages now.

The culvert under the driveway of 47L will be cleared.

The cart barn overhead door needs attention. ELS will investigate to see what is needed.

The trees and palmettos between the golf course and the yards along hole number 12 need attention. This is common area that is maintained by ELS. They plan to remove the palmettos.

The fence along hole #4 that separates Pine Lakes and Sunseekers has broken boards. ELS will replace the boards.

It was suggested that the steps to the big golf scoreboard be painted white for safety reasons. A resident fell here after checking the scores for a tournament.

# IN THE SPOT LIGHT By Barb Willis

We invited Ray Streeter to be our next "IN THE SPOTLIGHT" person of interest. He graciously accepted to take us thru the "PHASES" of his life. We hope you enjoy the trip.

Born November 29th, 1937 in Topeka, Kansas, Ray was one of eight children, 4 brothers and 3 sisters. Dad was a brick mason and Mom stayed home with the family.

Two of Ray's older brothers caddied at Shawnee Country Club and so when ray was 10, he said, that's what he wanted to do. After school and on week-ends the Club let him help out in the Pro Shop and with other duties until he was eventually able to caddy. As a caddy, you could play on Monday mornings but not having any clubs, the caddies borrowed member's clubs.

Although he never had a golf lesson, Ray managed to develop his game watching other players. At age 12, Ray entered and won his first tournament. Between the ages of 12-16 he played in many tournaments, winning 3 city tournaments and entering 2 national tournaments. Still not having clubs of his own, he borrowed clubs from the Pro's wife. When he turned 18, he won the City Match Play Tournament. And now we pass Phase 1 of his life.

Ray then attended Oklahoma State for a year on a golf scholarship, but decided that's not where he wanted to be so he went to California for 2 years where he worked and played golf a couple times a week. Wanting to be back home, he moved back to Topeka, and went to work for a drug distribution company. Ray also at this time started managing NCO Clubs and met Buck Ramsey. He'd seen Ray playing and offered to sponsor him on a few tours. After a time, funds ran low—so the touring ended! And so we move on to another Phase of his life.

We're in the mid 60's, now, and some friends called Ray to ask if he'd be their "fourth" for a bridge game where he was introduced to Linda, a sorority girl! He wooed her for a while and finally got a first date. They went to a movie, which led to a first good-nite kiss---and the rest is history. They've been married 50 yrs. and have 2 children, a boy and a girl.

And so we move to another "Phase". After marrying Linda in 1965, Ray helped run a new golf course in Topeka. But again, finances ran low and it closed. Next, Ray helped design and build Lake Shawnee Public Golf Course where he worked for 6yrs. From 1970-1975 Ray was Asst. Pro at

Topeka Country Club, and then went on to be manager and Pro at Topeka Public Golf Course. This was his life from 1975 -2002; Ray retired in July 2002.

During these 27 years, Ray and his family had many wonderful experiences as he traveled during those touring years. He entered many tournaments and he won 2 nationals and 5 senior championships. One highlight of his career was at Quall Creek in OK where he had a hole-in-one on #16 and won a 1990 Cadillac. It just so happened that the TV station that was broadcasting the event was testing their equipment and caught this SHOT so it was seen on national TV! A side note: When Ray and Linda moved to Pine Lakes, his first hole-in-one here was #16!! One of his fondest memories came in 1992, when he was scheduled to play with Arnold Palmer and later they had lunch together. Ray said Palmer did so much to promote the game of golf.

One of his biggest regrets happened at a practice round for a Senior Open -- Ray was waiting for his playing partners to join him and this fellow was already standing at the tee alone and asked if he'd like to join him. Ray said, no thanks, I'll wait for the other guys. That man was Lee Trevino! To this day, Ray doesn't know why he said "NO thanks"! He knows it would have been absolutely great!

And now on to a final Phase of Ray's life.

RETIREMENT: Now here we are, 2002 in Kansas, a really cold winter. Ray says to Linda, let's get out of here and go to Arizona. But Linda wanted to move to Florida. Guess who won??? They looked around a lot, but when they came to Pine Lakes, they thought the design was wonderful and the golf course, which Ray considers to be a "target" course, is great. They've been so fortunate to meet so many people and make new friends. Pine Lakes is truly a "melting pot" community. Ray has been Club Champion 11 years, and he's enjoyed golfing with all the people.

God has truly blessed Ray Streeter with a wonderful family, a great life and a "GOLF SWING"! Thank You!






We'll keep the presentation to an hour but will remain as long as there are questions.
