LIAISON MEETING

The November liaison meeting was held November 10 at 10:00 AM in the Living Room.

After discussing the homes that need attention for various reasons, we moved on to the 360 process. 360s are done by ELS management and letters are sent to residents informing them that work needs to be done to their yard or the exterior of their home.

A meeting was held November 3rd with ELS, Lake Fairways, and Pine Lakes to discuss the weir maintenance. Everyone was brought up to date on the latest permit from South Florida Water Management. The planks have now been put in the weirs in accordance with this permit. The schedule for removal and replacement of the planks will follow the schedule outlined in the 2010 permit.

It was brought to the attention of the Boards that salesmen are trying to sell driveways made from pavers. Residents on leased land are reminded that our driveways must be cement. Coatings can be added or boarders along the sides but the cement driveway cannot be removed.

We still have piles of debris from IRMA. Joshua Hill should have all of these removed in the next two weeks.

The clubhouse cleaning has improved.

The pool furniture should be wiped off and placed in an orderly arrangement each morning.

We are hoping that money for additional pool furniture will be approved in the 2018 budget.

We are still looking for an additional chef for the Pub.

We will be exploring plans for a major remodel of the Pub during 2018 so that we can ask for funds in the 2019 budget. Our community manager and regional manager will work with us to try and make this happen.

We have no information on approvals or rejections on items submitted for 2018 budget expenditures.



All of the veterans on the flight had previously been introduced to a "guardian" who was assigned to accompany them throughout the day. With safety being a primary concern, each veteran was given a wheelchair to facilitate his moving about to the various memorials to prevent any chance of a fall or misstep. A light breakfast was served and the group was bussed to the WWII Memorial where a group picture was taken of the 100+veterans from other communities as well as Pine Lakes.

The remainder of the morning included a visit to the spectacular Air Force Memorial and a visit to Arlington Cemetery where the veterans viewed the changing of the guard and a laying of a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. After a box lunch, the group was bussed to the Korean and the Vietnam Memorials. The beauty of each memorial that day gave rise to stirring memories, greatly moving the veterans to smiles and tears.

The day which began at 4:00 AM with the flight to Washington ended after 9:00 PM back at Southwest International Airport where hundreds of cheering family and friends had gathered to welcome the veterans back home. Young children rushed out to shake hands and pass pictures that they had made in school.

It was truly a blessing for those who had flown to Washington that day. The men & women were visibly overwhelmed. They stood taller and prouder for the appreciation shown for their service. Many thanks to the Collier County Honor Flight who sponsored this wonderful opportunity to our veterans.
