HOA II Starts a New Season

Although HOA II operates officially by the calendar year, in reality we flow with the season as do others activities here at Pine Lakes. We kicked off the beginning of our season with the September board of directors meeting September 15. There were a good number of members present even though most of the seasonal residents have not yet returned. As usual, most of the interest is the liaison meeting and the negotiations with ELS over the pass-through for garbage collection and the use of the wrong CPI period for rent increases. The discussion of the liaison meeting can be read in another article in this *Whispering Pines*. During the summer the mediation with ELS on the aforementioned issues came to a stand-still. Consequently, on July 22, 2014, HOA II filed a lawsuit in Lee County civil court naming Equity Lifestyle Properties as the defendant. On August 19, 2014, ELS filed their

PLEHOA Holds First Meeting of the New Season

The first meeting for the fall and the 2014-15 seasons was held in the ballroom on September 10. The full minutes of the meeting can be seen on pp 3 and 4 of this issue. We continue to have our primary emphasis on the roads. We have discussed the possibility of proceeding with a special assessment to fund legal action that would cause management to fulfill the intent of the contract and the prior arbitration award where Article 3.1 (b) of the agreement calls for ELS to maintain the streets.

At the liaison meeting in July, Sara Ferguson, then our Regional Manager, reported that she was

answer and affirmative defenses. So the process has started and will be a big part of our focus during future months.

Another of the main goals of HOAII is to assure that the life style we valued so highly is maintained in the manner described in our prospectus. This is always a challenge and many time compromises have to be made. There is never enough money in ELS' budget to do all the things we think necessary. We work constantly with PLEHOA (estate section board) and with ELS management to set priorities. Of course, as the saying goes, you can't please all the people all the time but HOA II hopes that we are doing what is best for the majority.

What do we need? First we need volunteers to run for the HOA II board of directors. To be on the board you must own a home in Pine Lakes and that home must be on a lot that you lease from ELS. You are required by our by-laws to attend 6 of the 9 meetings we have each year. The president of the board would like you to read our by-laws and section 723 of the Florida statues. The most important thing we are looking for is someone who cares about Pine Lakes and its residents.

The other thing we need is for each home to join the homeowners association. Our membership drive starts in November and runs through the annual meeting in January. We do, however, accept membership fees (\$20 per home) any time of the year. 723 of the Florida statues prohibits us from requiring each home be a member of the HOA but joining HOA II makes us a much stronger community.

The board meets the third Monday of every month except January when we hold our annual meeting with election of directors.

Residents can call any director listed in the front of the phone book with questions or comments about HOA II.

requesting \$297,500 for the roadway budget for 2015. She indicated she should know something by September. At the Liaison meeting on September 11, Julie Flake, our new GM, said she was hoping to know something in October. As of this writing, we still have no information. Sara Ferguson has been promoted to a Vice President level and we now have a new Regional Manager. We are attempting to remain optimistic.

Our next meeting is Wednesday, October 8th in the Living Room where we will determine what we need to do next. As you will recall, in 2014, four cul-de-sacs were repaved. At this rate, it will take in excess of 16 years to resurface the streets and many are well overdue now. Our contract with ELS expires in 2022. That used to sound like a very long time from now, but in fact, we will begin negotiations in 2021 which is just over six years from now. I find it difficult to believe we will have any success in coming to an agreement if we are still dealing with roads that are falling apart.

This is an issue that is viewed as being very important by your Board of Directors. Between now and the next meeting, you need to let your representatives know your stance, and you definitely should attend the meeting on the 8th.

We have had three meetings with our new GM, Julie Flake, and have found her to be cooperative and the meetings productive. Many issues under discussion have been and are being addressed. Julie is on time at the meetings, she is prepared with written documentation, and she communicates clearly. These are all positive factors for both boards as we go forward in our representation of all of you. I believe both boards work in the best interest of all the residents to provide you the kind of life you dreamed about for your retirement years. Right now, all I can say is, "Stay tuned!"

PLEHOA Board of Directors Meeting

The regular monthly meeting commencing this season of the Pine Lakes Estate Homeowners Association was held on September 10, 2014. President Luanne Putnam called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. In attendance, in addition to President Putnam, were Treasurer Robert Morse, ARC Chair Bo Kromas, and Secretary Peter Talty. Vice President Charles Matthews was excused. Also, There were 42 guests present.

The Secretary's Report was read, and there were no corrections. Motion was made and seconded to accept the report.

Treasurer's Report: There were no additional attorney's fees and there is presently only one delinquent home on our books with one more additional one to be added. This significant reduction in delinquent homes coupled with the increase in PLEHOA dues has strengthened our treasury. The semi-annual fee to ELS of \$407, 000 has been paid. Motion was made and seconded, and the Treasurer's Report was accepted. The complete Treasurer's Report has been posted.

ARC Report: Bo noted that an ARC request was submitted to the office, but was not forwarded onto Bo until just recently. The request was accepted. The following requests were approved: a fence at 27M, and color changes at 6C and 22F. A motion was made and seconded to accept the ARC Report.

OLD BUSINESS:

will not take place until tomorrow, so she reported only on the results of the previous meeting.

1. Clarification on access to the Horticulture Pit: Outside contractors may also dispose of their waste but only on Wednesdays and Fridays in the dumpster and provided that they arrive at Pine Lakes with empty vehicles. For everyone, it is important that we not break the rules and that only put horticulture waste and no plastic bags in the dumpster so that this privilege can be continued.
2. The Bocce courts have been re-carpeted.
3. The prototype gate for the pool has been completed and is awaiting final approval prior to installation.
4. The Women's bathroom has been renovated, but the bathrooms at the pool have not.
5. The gate at the Guard house is now operating.
6. The ELS Manager has processed eviction notices to the family of nine living in one home and to the convicted felon living in another.
7. The Activity Room has been re-carpeted and the Card Room and Craft Room may also be re-done.
8. Dues notices went out late because ELS lost the data base, but this has now been resolved.
9. ELS management changes include the promotion of Sara Ferguson to Vice President and the appointment of Julie Flake as Pine Lakes Manager replacing Steve Foligno.
10. Prior to Sara's promotion, she had requested \$297,000 from ELS for road repairs, but the results of this request will not be known until October.
11. In examining our PLEHOA contract, President Putnam has noted some areas where we need to strengthen our side when the contract is replaced in 2022.
12. President Putnam thanked the residents for accepting the dues increase and for paying their dues on time. She also explained once again that we do not have the option of not paying our dues to ELS. Our contract specifically states that

the Board has the legal responsibility to anticipate expenses and to raise dues accordingly.

13. Relevant to the roads issue where we were previously successful in taking ELS to Mediation, regardless of what some parties may like us to believe, that mediation is binding. The roads continue to still be of concern and we would like to see ELS come forth with a specific plan to replace all roads in a timely fashion.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. President Putnam was asked for her assessment of the new Manager, and she was most positive in describing Julie's excellent responsiveness to our issues to date. It is anticipated that Julie will be attending a meeting of the Women's Club in the near future.
2. Ruth Zabierek, our FMO representative, announced that the visit from Representative Mathew Caldwell went very well, and he was very receptive and had a good response regarding our concerns.
3. President Putnam announced that Julie Flake has requested and received emergency funding to replace the shuffleboard courts. She also reiterated that she will continue to only ask ELS for what is in our contract. The shuffleboard courts are considered an amenity and thus requesting that they be replaced is consistent with this approach.
4. It was asked if there was a policy regarding gifts that the Men's Club makes to Pine Lkes. President Putnam explained that this has been discussed, and that she may know more about this after tomorrow's meeting. This issue came about in relation to the Tiki Huts that the Men's Club purchased which now need new roofs. ELS may continue their practice of maintaining gifts like this, seek to share replacement and repair costs, or no longer accept this responsibility.
5. Residents expressed great concern over the status of the Pub, and this is being looked at by the new Manager.
6. The issuing and dispensing of stickers at the Guard House seems inconsistent.
7. President Putnam regrettably accepted the resignation of Bob Morse as treasurer and asked for someone to volunteer to replace Bob.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn at 8:10 PM.

September Liaison Meeting

The first item on the agenda was the pool gates. At the close of the meeting, Judy and Luanne looked at the proposed gate and agreed it will work fine. ELS will now review the gate with Lee County code enforcement. The gates will only open with a key from the outside, but will open with a handle on the inside. Residents leaving the pool area to go to the rest rooms are reminded that they will need to take their key with them to gain re-entry into the pool.

Residents have requested that the signs at the pool listing the rules be updated and relocated. Luanne will present a proposal at the next meeting.

Due to issues at the pool when the office is closed, we are considering a roving guard for the pool area.

The pool radio and speakers need repair/upgrade. The radio amplifier must be able to be connected to the plug on the patio area so keyboards, etc. can use the amplifier. ELS is working on this.

The stage lights are now working again, but have been modified. We agreed that we could work through the 2014-2015 season with what we have, but we still would like to upgrade to LED lights. Money was requested in the 2015 budget, but we do not know yet if the funds were allocated.

Everyone knows the roads are a major priority. We are waiting on the 2015 budget before we can do any planning on what can be done with the roads.

We discussed a new ELS policy for donations to the community. All suggested donations will be reviewed by this board. Luanne and Judy will speak for the residents as they are the legal representatives of the residents of Pine Lakes. Julie Flake will speak for ELS. All parties have to agree for the donation to be accepted. This new policy was applied to a proposal for a pergola at the pool. The pool party committee is proposing this to provide shade for the volunteers cooking at the grilles. The proposal was for the pool party to pay ½ of the cost and ELS to pay the remainder. Judy and Luanne signed off on the project. Julie asked to have the project tabled until she could investigate the need for a Lee County permit and the cost to ELS.

Dead pine trees are a major concern right now. Some will damage homes if they fall. Julie said there is no money in the budget for tree removal. Also of concern is the spreading of the beetle infestation that is killing the trees.

When ELS does a 360 inspection of the community, and a home is deemed to be in need of maintenance, a letter is sent to the home owner with a time limit to have the maintenance completed. If the maintenance is not done in the allotted time, ELS has the right to perform the maintenance and charge the homeowner. Julie agreed to publish the going rate for doing this maintenance. Pole lights not working and weedy yards are the main issues right now.

The paint job at the ladies room by the Pub was discussed. The main complaint was the mustard color on the inside of the door instead of continuing the soft green of the rest of the interior. Also some spots need to be touched up.

There were some issues with private parties in the clubhouse this summer. Some people did not get the packets with instructions on the use of the facilities and the inspections required. It was determined that a permanent receptionist will most likely eliminate this problem.

Speeding continues to be a problem in the community. Before we start having the Lee County Sheriff ticket people, we are going to place a sign in the community displaying the speed of the vehicle passing the sign. The sign will originally be close to the entrance of the community and then be moved to Circle Pine Road by Diamond Hill Court.

An incident at the Pub on April 7th was discussed at length. Some ELS employees were terminated and other actions are under investigation. This is mentioned here to impress residents that both boards feel this type of behavior should not be tolerated at Pine Lakes, and we will do everything we can do legally to ensure it doesn't happen again.

The liaison meetings are held on the second Thursday of each month. Residents are encouraged to discuss their concerns with board members to have them added to the agenda.

The horticulture pit will be unlocked and manned by a staffer Monday through Friday from 2-3 PM for contractors to deposit horticulture taken from Pine Lakes and Lake Fairways residences ONLY. Contractors must enter Pine Lakes and Lake Fairways with empty vehicles to be permitted to deposit horticulture in the Pine Lakes/Lake Fairways pit.

Bee Problems Happen!

An August 29, 2014 article in the local paper described firefighters donning "bee-suits" to remove troublesome bees from a home. In the past, bees have swarmed at several Pine Lakes homes.

Whispering Pines called the North Fort Myers Fire District to learn if they also remove bees in bee-suits. They don't!

If bees colonize on your property, the man to call is Keith Counsell. He is the local expert beekeeper who the authorities call. His number is: 239-839-4479.

Coyotes Present In Pine Lakes

A male, female, and two coyote pups were seen this summer near the maintenance buildings here in Pine Lakes. The animals were reported to our security gate (731-2500) and a trapper was contacted. The pups and female were trapped, but not the male.

Small dogs and cats are at risk if a coyote is encountered. The following advice from The Florida Fish and Wildlife Service may be helpful. A more detailed document can be picked up at our reception desk.

Co-Existing With Coyotes

Coyotes can be curious but are also timid and generally run away if challenged. Just remember that any wild animal will protect itself or its young. Never initiate a close encounter with a coyote.

If a coyote approaches too closely, immediately act aggressively toward the coyote. Wave your arms, throw things like stones and shout. If necessary, make yourself appear larger by standing up or stepping onto a rock, stump or stair. Convince the coyote you are a potential danger to be avoided.

Where coyote encounters occur regularly, walk pets at other times besides nighttime hours, dusk and dawn. Carry something that will make noise or scare the animal, such as a small air horn, big water pistol, solid walking stick, golf club or paintball gun. These things may deter the coyote at close range. Make a "coyote shaker" by putting a few washers, pebbles or pennies into an empty soft drink can. Wrap the can in foil and tape closed. Continue "hazing" the coyote until the animal leaves; otherwise the coyote will learn to wait to leave until the activity stops.

Origin of RT 41 Found


