**APRIL LIAISON MEETING MINUTES**

April 10, 2019

- Road resurfacing is completed for 2019. Cul-de-Sac's 19, 20, 49, 50, & 51 were resurfaced.
- 360 inspection continue on a regular basis. Letters are being sent and residents are responding.
- Street signs in need of repair have been identified and will be replaced as budget funds become available. Julie will ask for funds in 2020 Budget to repair/replace all unreadable signs. Also, all common area signs will be addressed except for golf course signage.
- Seawall repair is taking longer than planned. Julie will follow up with the contractor.
- Julie stated that the trees around the pool area will be trimmed by Joshua.
- Shrub trimming on various walking paths and golf cart paths is being addressed. Trimming will take place on 60 D,C, &F, 54F. Ted will repair the sidewalk at 59 G&I. Maintenance will ride the golf course and trim trees / bushes by the cart path.
- Replacement of mailbox tubes has currently begun and will continue as ongoing maintenance.
- There is a work order in place to look into the Waste Pro leak on Circle Pine. The asphalt will be patched when the paving contractor is back in the Fort Myers area.
- The clubhouse roof replacement is on schedule. The canopy in front will be replaced as soon as the roof is completed. The decorative dormer has been removed due to wood rot.
- Management will look into various options to have lighting installed under the canopy. The roof should be completed by the end of April.
- A new upright exercise bike has been ordered for the Exercise Room.

- Tape will be placed at the stepdown area in the Pub dining area.
- The lights in the lobby of the clubhouse will remain on until the building is locked up at night.
- The missing lights on the bridge by the 18th hole will be replaced. The light pole will be picked up and re-installed.
- Julie stated that the culverts and drainage areas will be checked over the next 30 days to prepare for the rainy season.
- ELS management will look into who is responsible to trim the trees at the entry to Frenchman's Ct.
- ELS management has sent a letter to the owner who allows his dog to run loose. Julie suggested that if you see an unleashed dog to call Fort Myers Animal Control, as there is a leash law in Lee County.
- Julie will send a copy of the Rules and Regulations to Ron Hovet, Dick Loubier and Cindy Ahrens.
- ELS Management has advised the owner at 59E that the shed must be removed. Another shed has been identified on 43H. Julie will advise this owner of the policy as well.
- The trash cans at the Horseshoe pits, Bocce and Tennis courts will be emptied on a regular basis.
- Julie stated that the 2020 Budget will include funds to resurface Pine Lakes Blvd from Rte. 41 to Circle Pine Rd.
- The gate to the storage area has been fixed.
- The ice maker in the kitchen is not working properly. Julie will follow up.
- The subject of fences on leased land was discussed. Julie stated that if a similar fence is requested to one that has already been approved, then that fence will be approved.
- Dick mentioned that there were hornets in the ladies' room, most likely due to the roof replacement.
- Cindy requested that the revised Covenants for Estate homes be included in the ELS closing package.
- Certain individuals in the Pine Lakes Veterans Association would like to fly the Canadian flag in the Veteran's area outside of the clubhouse. Some Veterans oppose this suggestion. Julie suggested that the Veterans and the Men's Club meet and resolve this issue.
- Julie asked both HOA's to submit proposed projects for the 2020 Budget.

 Renovate the pool bathrooms  
 Seawall replacement on hole #10  
 Repaving of roads  
 Clubhouse roof replacement

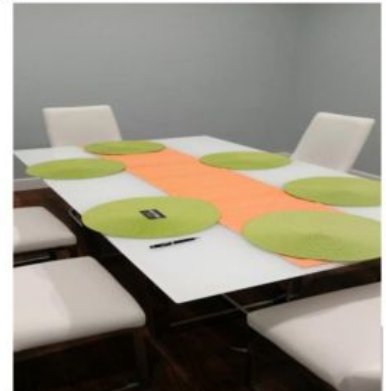

## PINE LAKES ESTATES HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING MINUTES APRIL 10, 2019

The Board meeting was held on April 10, 2019, in the Living Room of the Clubhouse. In addition to President Dick Loubier, Vice President Matt Heier, Treasurer Wendy Saniti, ARC Chair Bob Godek, and Secretary Cindy Ahrens, there were 15 homeowners present. The meeting was called to order by President Loubier at 7:00 PM beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence. There was one new homeowner present—David Groh at 7-T.

Secretary Ahrens reported that the minutes from the March 13, 2019 Board meeting had been posted in the April Whispering Pines and were posted on the official bulletin board. Request for any corrections/changes. Hearing none, motion/second to accept by Ahrens/Saniti was approved.

Treasurer Saniti presented the Treasurer report. Motion to accept the report was made/seconded by Heier/Godek and was approved. The full report will be posted on the bulletin board across from the Exercise Room.

ARC Chair Godek reported that 2 requests (1 for house painting, 1 for widening driveway) had been submitted and approved.

**LIAISON REPORT** from President Loubier: March report was published in the April Whispering Pines. The next meeting is April 11 with Loubier & Ahrens attending from PLEHOA.

### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Ahrens reported on research into a state organization that represents resident-owned communities, FLAROC. She spoke with a Board member from FLAROC about the unique circumstances in Pine Lakes with combination of lease properties with estate properties. Decision was that PLEHOA did not fit FLAROC or FMO, but after brief conversation with Maura Alexander, FMO was the better option to protect all properties.

### NEW BUSINESS

2019/2020 PLEHOA Board Meeting schedule was distributed to the Board members and was approved. Schedule will be posted on bulletin board and will be included on the PLEHOA web section.

### ISSUES FROM MEMBERS:

- Linda Dowd asked about agreement with ELS.
- Member asked how many property assessments have not been paid as of January 2019: 2 properties, both with current liens, Loubier and Saniti are working with owners for solution.
- Dog walking on Circle Pines area: issue with owners not cleaning up after dogs.
- Request for dusk to dawn no mowing on golf course, mowing too early in mornings, too noisy.
- Yard mowers are driving too fast, hard to get out of the way.
- Mowers are hitting some of the water meter cases – who to contact for repairs?

**ADJOURNMENT:** It was moved/seconded by Ahrens/Heier to adjourn; President Loubier adjourned the meeting at 7:31 PM. The next Board meeting is scheduled for May 8, 2019, Clubhouse Living Room, 7:00 PM.

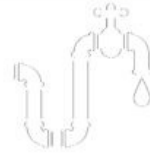
