

#### **C.E.R.T.** Mike Gloss

Lee County E.O.C. (Emergency Operations Center) and North Fort Myers Fire Department has asked the Pine Lakes C.E.R.T. team to help them identify residents that choose to stay in place when a Mandatory Evacuation Order has been issued by Florida State officials for manufactured homes (Pine Lakes). The Mandatory Evacuation Order is usually ordered when high winds are expected as with a hurricane, tornado, or a storm surge.

Our solution is to have **RESIDENTS WHO CHOOSE TO STAY IN PLACE** complete a short form (sample below) that can be obtained at the Gate House or concierge desk and deposit it in the Emergency Evacuation Box located on the exit side of the Gate House wall. This information may be used by First Responders to expedite rescue response time after a disaster.

Please plan ahead. If mandatory evacuation is ordered, complete and deposit the form as soon as you make your decision to stay.

#### LIAISON MEETING MINUTES JUNE 8, 2023

Pine Lakes Clubhouse Living Room -- 2:00 PM Present:

**Kevin** introduced himself to the members of HOA's present, and gave us a little background of his experience in property management. He will be staying here as the Manager of both properties and Julie will be his Regional Manager. Kevin hired a new permanent Maintenance Supervisor named Bob Schule, who he worked with previously, and has been with ELS for 17 years.

#### These answers are from Kevin Karau:

**Pool Area:** The No smoking/vaping signs for the pool are ordered, and will be installed when they arrive. He will look into putting an extra table and umbrella designated for the smoking area at the pool, possibly outside gate near kitchen.

Additional garbage pails are ordered for the pool, with flap closure to keep out rodents.

Small tiki huts will be repaired under IAN damage funding. Contractors are behind schedule.

Canopies at pool and bocce are ordered and contract signed. They are going to expedite shade by pool but bocce is special order and will take longer.

The pool deck will be repainted with appropriate heatresistant paint. Grout will be inspected so it can get completed.

Tables will be painted with polyurethane to make for easier cleaning.

A new shower is ordered to put by spa to replace one taken out during IAN.

Pool Kitchen is being budgeted for repair *continued next page...* 

**Pub:** The grill is ordered and should be replaced in 5 weeks or less.

The budget is being worked for permanent repairs to pub or possibly new pub all together. Kevin will update when ELS decides.

**Golf course:** Continually working with Davey to prepare for course upgrades and enhancements, as the budget allows.

Traps are being put out by hole #12 to remove animals nesting too close to course for safety.

**Clubhouse:** gutters are being cleaned and contract is signed with vendor for further roof cleanup. Ballroom floor cleaning will be done in off season.

**Community:** Name plate signs are being installed, should be completed by end of the month. Multiple names are alright if needed.

Street signs are on backorder, management plans to complete in 30-45 days.

Safety concerns were discussed about bridge that goes to hole #10 and will be inspected.

Kevin is working with Joshua Tree to prioritize removing dead trees, then trees leaning too much. All tree and stump removal will be done as funding affords. Priority for safety is given, and should be communicated to management asap.

RV storage area fencing is contracted and should be installed next week.

Storm drains are being cleared for the rainy season and approximately 10% is left to check at this time.

360 degree inspections will start in September after management has had time to notify all residents that the 360's are starting.


#### Gentle Reminders: Membership Dues Increase

Working with the printer in Cape Coral is pretty slick since they do the entire layout of the WP, solicit all the advertising, and collect all the payments. And--you don't need to be a full-time resident as it's all accomplished via email using Word software.

#### **Quick Overview of Responsibilities:**

• Schedule the yearly submission deadlines and publish these.

- Receive articles by deadlines and confirm receipt with each submitter or respond appropriately if the submission doesn't meet guidelines.
- Track submissions of the regular article authors and email anyone who hasn't met their deadline.
- Using Word, cut and paste all articles into one "WP ARTICLES" document and email to Stinger. NOTE: The editor does NOT write the articles, but does review for typo errors, missing punctuation, and simple formatting.
- Email any additional items for the issue, e.g. photos, entertainment list, to Stinger.
- Review the "proof" of the publication from Stinger and edit or verify it is print ready.

Cindy is developing written procedures and gathering samples to make the transition to a new editor smooth and painfree, and she will be here on site to assist in the hand-off.

#### ANOTHER VITAL VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY! WHISPERING PINES CIRCULATION COORDINATOR NEEDED ASAP!!

Oh, no! Our Whispering Pines Circulation Coordinator Rhonda Baldwin is moving away in July! New volunteer/volunteer team is needed as quickly as possible for this critical position. Please consider stepping up to take on this essential role, either as a solo coordinator or as a couple or a team of friends. We need you!

What is involved? About 4-5 hours each time an issue is printed, 10 times a year, plus a couple hours in the summer months for monthly calendar and flyer distribution. While a year-around resident is preferable, "off season" can be covered as needed.

#### Here's what you do:

• Receive a count from each court captain of the number of households in residence each time there is an upcoming issue, add up those numbers, and notify the printer of the total needed for the community for each issue.

• Receive supply for the entire community from the printer of the newsletter, monthly calendars, and flyers to deliver with that newsletter.

• Count out the number of newsletters, calendars, and flyers to go to each court based on the numbers provided to you by the court captains.

#### NOTE: You do NOT stuff the flyers into the issues-court and cul-de-sac captains do that.

• Deliver the newsletters, calendars, and the flyers to the court captains' homes for them and the cul-de-sac captains to stuff and deliver to their cul-de-sac residents.

#### Important Dates in Military History: June is PTSD Awareness Month

June 6 – D-Day – Anniversary of the World War II Allied Invasion in Normandy, France June 12 – Women Veterans Day June 11-17 National Flag Week June 14 – Flag Day / Army Birthday (1775) June 23 – Coast Guard Auxiliary Birthday (1939) June 25 – Anniversary of the start of the Korean War June 27 National PTSD Awareness Day

#### July 4 – Independence Day

On July 4th, 1776 the United States laid down its claim to be a free and independent nation by adopting the Declaration of Independence. Today, Independence Day is celebrated and honored in many forms such as fireworks, BBQs and parades. It is an opportunity for Americans to express patriotism and love of country including reflecting on the sacrifices from those in the military.

#### July 27 - National Korean War Veterans Armistice Day

It is a time to remember as many as 50,000 American troops who died in the conflict (official sources vary on the actual number), and over 100,000 wounded, and thousands of prisoners of war.

#### July 28 - National Buffalo Soldiers Day

Celebrates the contributions of some of the earliest African-American troops in the United States military. These troops served on the Western frontier after the Civil War. They served in a variety of ways including security, law enforcement, and other frontier-specific activities. In 1866, Congress passed legislation known as the Army Organization Act, which formalized the creation of six all-Black U.S. Cavalry and infantry units.

#### July 29 – Anniversary of the Army Chaplain Corps

The United States Army Chaplain Corps is a unique part of American military tradition. Said to be among the smallest (if not THE smallest) unit in the U.S. Army, the Chaplain Corps predates Independence Day and since this unit began, chaplains have served in every American conflict.

#### August is Anti-terrorism Awareness Month August 4 – Coast Guard Day

Coast Guard Day is held each year on Aug. 4th to recognize and honor the efforts of The United States Coast Guard. This celebration is considered an "internal" event for active and reserve Coast Guard members, plus their civilian employees and retirees and members of the Coast Guard Auxiliary.

#### August 7 – Purple Heart Day

A time for Americans to remember and honor the brave men and women who were either wounded on the battlefield or paid the ultimate sacrifice with their lives. Purple Heart Day is also known as National Purple Heart Day, Purple Heart Recognition Day, and Purple Heart Appreciation Day.

August 10 - DoD Birthday (1949)

#### August 10 - Agent Orange Awareness Day

An annual observation designed to raise awareness of the effects of the herbicide known as Agent Orange, used in Vietnam by American forces to defoliate future and current battlegrounds with the purpose of depriving the enemy ground cover to hide in.

#### August 14 - National Navajo Code Talkers Day

This holiday honors the contributions of Native Americans / First Nations people who contributed to the United States war effort during World War Two, as well as recognizing the evolution of U.S. code related to Native American languages and the participation of First Nations tribe members in U.S. military efforts from many conflicts.

#### August 16 - National Airborne Day

Celebrates the accomplishments of Army parachute tradition. The Army's Airborne Rangers and the Army Golden Knights parachute team are among the best-known American paratrooper organizations, and the accomplishments of Army paratroopers are noted across more than seven decades of service including the Iraq war in 2003.

#### August 29 - The Marine Corps Reserve Day

(also known as the United States Marine Forces Reserve or the U.S. Marine Corps Forces Reserve) was created in 1916, in conjunction with the creation of the Navy Reserve. Since then, the evolution of this force would expand from just thirty-five to today's roughly 40,000 Marine Corps Reservists.

*Have you heard of the Brick Program?* Our brick program allows U.S. Military veterans and their families to honor their service by purchasing a brick, which is placed in the Veteran's Memorial (in front of the clubhouse). We will continue to plan for more fun events for the next season and as always, we thank you for your support of *The Entertainment Committee. Enjoy your summer!* 






#### PINE LAKES SHUFFLEBOARD – SUMMER 2023






