

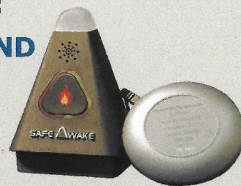


Can you hear your alarm?

The Importance of Smoke Alarms



Did You Know:

- When you are asleep, you can't smell smoke.
- 3 out of 5 fire deaths happen in homes with no working smoke alarms.
- Half of home fire deaths occur between 11p.m. and 7a.m. when most people are asleep.

Have A Plan:

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home.
- Interconnect all smoke alarms throughout the home so that when one sounds, they will all sound.
- Make sure everyone knows the sound of your smoke alarm and can hear it. Request a smoke alarm accessory from the CCFD if anyone in your home is hearing impaired.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month.
- If the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside.
